Leaves brought to the recycle center by residents resulted in 2 dumpsters being filled and is estimated to have saved close to \$30,000 in taxpayer expense, allowing our Public Works Crew to patch roads and prepare the trucks for inclement weather; an executive session will be held prior to the 2020 Reorganization. Copies of the Township Officials list will be given to the Board of Supervisors; the reorganization meeting of the Board of Supervisors will be held on Monday, January 6, 2020 at 7:00 p.m., and the first regular meeting of the Board will be held immediately following; and the reorganization meeting of the Township Auditors will be held on Tuesday, January 7, 2020 at 6:00 p.m.

Pipech asked the Ryan Carter of the Fire Company to present the Fire Company update. Pipech also thanked the Fire Company for their prompt and professional work when the tree fell at Burma Road and Nuangola Road.

The Board of Supervisors, Police and Employees wish everyone a very happy, safe and healthy Holiday Season.

SOLICITOR'S REPORT: Attorney McCormick from the Solicitor's office had no report.

PUBLIC COMMENT: Pat Rushton asked about the H2O grant application. Pipech explained that it is the same dam for which we received prior grants, but the cost to complete the project far exceeds those amounts. McCormick noted that the litigation with A.R. Popple continues. Resident Barbara Miller inquired about the Stormwater Management Grant. Pipech responded that the project was along Ralph Street and would extend down both sides of Heslop Road from Ralph Street. The paving would extend down to Nuangola Road.

MOTION by Smith, second by Arnold, to adjourn. Meeting adjourned at 7:28 p.m.
